## **CF107 CREATIVE BIBLE STUDY METHODS**

## INTRODUCTION

This course discusses in depth the Bible which is the written Word of the one true God. Throughout the twenty two lessons we will unpack the Bible and many creative methods for studying the word of God.

The word "Bible" means "the books." The Bible is one volume which consists of 66 separate books.

The word "Scripture" is also used to refer to God's Word. This word comes from a Latin word which means "writing." When the word "Scripture" is used with a capital "S" it means the sacred writings of the one true God. The word "Bible" is not used in the Bible. It is a word used by men as a title for all of God's Words.

The Bible is divided into two major sections called the Old Testament and the New Testament. The four divisions of the Old Testament books are:

- Law
- History
- Poetry
- Prophecy

The four divisions of the New Testament books:

- Gospels
- History
- Letters
- Prophecy

This course will also give a summary of each of the 66 books of the Bible which make up the major divisions of the Old and New Testaments. It provides an introduction to the content of both testaments. Four suggestions for successful Bible reading are given and you will choose a systematic plan to start reading God's Word.
